Conditions of Entry

1. The Regatta is open to all Club and Composite crews and is held under British Rowing Rules of Racing.
2. Tees Regatta is a busy multi-lane course using stake-boats, please ensure that all coxes and those in coxless boats are competent to be able to back down onto a stake-boat. The gap between races does not allow for long to achieve this and excessive delays may result in disqualification.
3. The draw will take place at the address overleaf, commencing on 7 May at 11:00 and will be published by Tuesday, 11 May, 2010 on the Tees Rowing Club website, www.teesrowingclub.co.uk.
4. Crews who change status on Saturday 8 May or Sunday 9 May should inform the Regatta Chairman by 20:00 of the same day by phone (number given overleaf). Providing there is the event, crews shall be then entered in the next highest status event. Please use the comments facility on OARA to flag up if a change of status is a possibility
5. Entry fees are not refundable once the draw is published. In the event of the Regatta being cancelled by the Race Committee, in whole or in part, the Regatta Committee will consider the refund of entry fees to crews in events not raced.
6. Please note that doubling within a division of competitors, boats or equipment is not allowed.
7. Competitors must be at the start 5 minutes before the time of the race. Every reasonable effort will be made to ensure everyone races but the umpires will be strict with the times, and make the final decision regarding disqualification.
8. Competitors must provide their own boats and blades. Committee boats for adaptive rowers may be available but must be requested at the time of entry.
9. Clubs are reminded it is their responsibility to insure their equipment and to ensure that those they are entering are prepared and competent to race.
10. All boats must be fitted with a plastic number plate fitting, to slot numbers on the bows.
11. Coxes requiring dead weight must bring their own, clearly identifiable, weights.
12. All competitors must produce a valid British Rowing registration card prior to collecting their race number. It will be retained until each competitor has completed racing,.
13. Every effort shall be made to accommodate Adaptive entries. Please contact the Regatta Chairman for specific requirements
14. The Regatta Committee reserve the right to alter the list of entries after publication. Every reasonable effort shall be made to ensure all entries get a race.
15. A minimum of 3 entries from two different clubs are required for an event to be held. If insufficient entries are received, the entries will be placed in the next age group or status group for the class of boat unless an alternative is clearly stated. The Regatta Chairman will endeavour to contact Club Secretaries and Teachers i/c of Rowing to resolve any difficulties. Please provide contact phone numbers, for daytime and evening for this purpose. Entrants for Junior events should indicate if they are NOT willing to be moved to a Senior Category, if there are insufficient entries in their nominated Junior event.
16. Junior A and B statuses may be combined in a given event, if insufficient entries are received in either..
17. Veteran Handicaps will be applied at the start in accordance with guidance laid down in the British Rowing Almanac.
18. There will be presentation pewter prizes for all events
