Events are offered at Open, Women and Mixed classes including para / adaptive rowing. Senior, Junior and Masters events with 6 or more entries may be banded based on ranking points.

Pennants will be awarded for overall fastest men's and women's crews.

Glass tankards will be presented in events which have a minimum of three crews racing.

## **Tees Small Boats Head - Entries & Fees**

Entries by BROE2 only and entries close at **7pm Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> October.**

All substitutions should be made as far as possible on BROE2 by noon Friday 11<sup>th</sup> October. Any further substitutions must be reported on the day to race control.

Senior & Masters events      - £8.00 per rowing/sculling seat  
Junior events                      - £6.00 per rowing/sculling seat

Payment to be made through BROE2 (coxes are free) and should be made before close of entries. In the event of cancellation, a refund of 50% of the entry fee will be made.

State on entry form if you are NOT prepared to compete in a higher age group if the one you have entered is not being raced. Masters events will be run using the British Rowing Handicap system. Events may be formed by combining age categories and/or banding based on ranking points.

Inclusion doubles (one adaptive and one non-adaptive sculler) are encouraged to enter as Senior. Please add a note in BROE or email us to flag your entry. If sufficient entries are received, they will race as a separate Group and prizes will be awarded.

INSURANCE: Note that BR membership insurance is only valid for UK residents who are resident in this country for more than six months in a year. Evidence of insurance cover must be provided by those not covered by BR membership insurance.

All boats must have a slot for taking plastic numbers on the bow.

Crews must be capable of coping with the distance and potentially windy and choppy conditions. Coxes and steersmen should be experienced and able to steer around tight bends.
