#### **RULES AND CONSTITUTION**

You may have established from Committee meeting minutes, that due to ambiguity and contradiction in sections, Karami and I carried out a comprehensive review of the Club Rules and Constitution. The Committee endorsed our suggestions for change.

Under the Covid 19 Government exception ruling the Committee has been allowed to hold meetings electronically, although this is not stated in our Club constitution. The committee have found this method of communication to be highly effective. By adding it explicitly to our constitution, this would remove any doubt going forward. Both BR and Northern Rowing Council have updated their articles at AGM so they can hold AGM's electronically in the future.

This is one of several proposals by the committee which are highlighted in the Draft April 2021 Constitution document. (See separate document)

The Club Rules have been updated and sections renumbered. Changes have been highlighted. (See separate document).

#### **MEMBERSHIP FEES**

The committee proposes that the fees remain the same as the fees agreed at the 2020/2021 AGM. However, we propose to continue to charge at 75% of the 2019/20 fees during lockdown. See further comments on the attached.

#### **PRIVATE BOAT INSURANCE**

Following the review of members Private Boat insurance, in line with club policy, I am pleased to report all members fully comply.

### **SWIMMING COMPETENCY**

Following the review of members competency to swim 100m in light clothing (in line with current club constitution), the % return of acknowledgement has increased from 29% to 81%. This is creeping up slowly and members will not be allowed back on the water without this confirmation.

## **BENEVOLENT FUND**

In March 2019, the Committee agreed to set up the Benevolent Fund to provide help for those who cannot afford in the short term to pay to participate in the sport of rowing, including participation in racing. We are pleased that this fund is being used for the benefit of club membership.

### **TEES RIVER RESCUE**

In September, the committee welcomed James Ruddock from Tees River Rescue to share the aims and objectives of the charity. The committee welcomed this new alliance.

# **OBITUARY**

'Stan Collingwood' rowed for Thames RC and then Auriol Kensington, representing the latter at Henley Royal Regatta in 1968. He had a long career in coaching, event organisation, umpiring and leadership in all aspects of our sport. He volunteered at every World Championship event held in the UK from 1986 Championship at Nottingham to the 2012 Olympics at Eton Dorney. In 2003 he was awarded the BR Medal of Honour. More recently, Stan successfully coached the Tees RC Masters G/H group to two gold medals at the 2019 World Masters Championships in Hungary.
