Coxed Quads	Senior, Masters (A-K), J15, J14, J13
Coxless Quads	Senior, Masters (A-K), J18, J17, J16
Coxless Pairs	Senior, Masters (A-K), J18, J17, J16
Double Sculls	Senior, Masters (A-K), J18, J17, J16, J15, J14, J13
Single Sculls	Senior, Masters (A-K), J18, J17, J16, J15, J14, J13

Events are offered at Open, Women and Mixed classes including para / adaptive rowing. Competition Framework Event Bands: Events may be split into bands based on ranking points. The aim will be to create competition.

Glass trophies will be presented to the winners in events/bands in which 3 or more boats have started.

Tees Small Boats Head - Entries & Fees

Entries by BROE2 only. British Rowing Day Tickets will be accepted.

Entries will open at 9am Friday 4th September and close at **10pm Saturday 3rd October.**

All substitutions should be made as far as possible on BROE2 by 7am on Saturday 10th October. Any further substitutions must be reported on the day to race control.

Senior & Masters events - £13.00 per rowing/sculling seat

Junior events -£11.00 per rowing/sculling seat

Payment to be made through BROE2 and should be made before close of entries

State on entry form if Junior Crews are NOT prepared to compete in a higher age group if the one you have entered is not being raced.

Masters events may be formed by combining age categories using the British Rowing Handicap system, and if there are sufficient entries by banding based on ranking points.

Mixed Ability doubles (one adaptive/para and one non-adaptive/para sculler) are encouraged to enter as Senior. Please add a note in BROE or email us to flag your entry. If sufficient entries are received in comparable categories, they will race as a separate event and prizes will be awarded.

Para and adaptive entries are encouraged: please email us with information to help accommodate the crew.

INSURANCE: Note that BR membership insurance is only valid for UK residents who are resident in this country for more than six months in a year. Evidence of insurance cover must be provided by those not covered by BR membership insurance.

All boats must have a slot for taking plastic numbers on the bow.

Crews must be capable of coping with the distance and potentially windy and choppy conditions. Coxes and steersmen should be experienced and able to steer around tight bends.

Although unlikely, should it be necessary to cancel the event, the entry fees will be refunded, minus non-recoverable expenses.
